Students Satisfaction Survey (Key Indicator 2.7.1) has been conducted by IQAC on the format given by NAAC. The SSS questionnaire which consist of 20 objective & onesubjective question has been used,which is available in NAAC website.

Sample: Sample for the student satisfaction Survey consists of 150 students from all the 12 departments of the college.

Data Analysis: There are 20 objective questions and students' response was taken on a scale of 4 to 0, with the most positive response rated as 4 and most negative response rated as 0. The mean score for each question was calculated and the overall mean was arrived at.

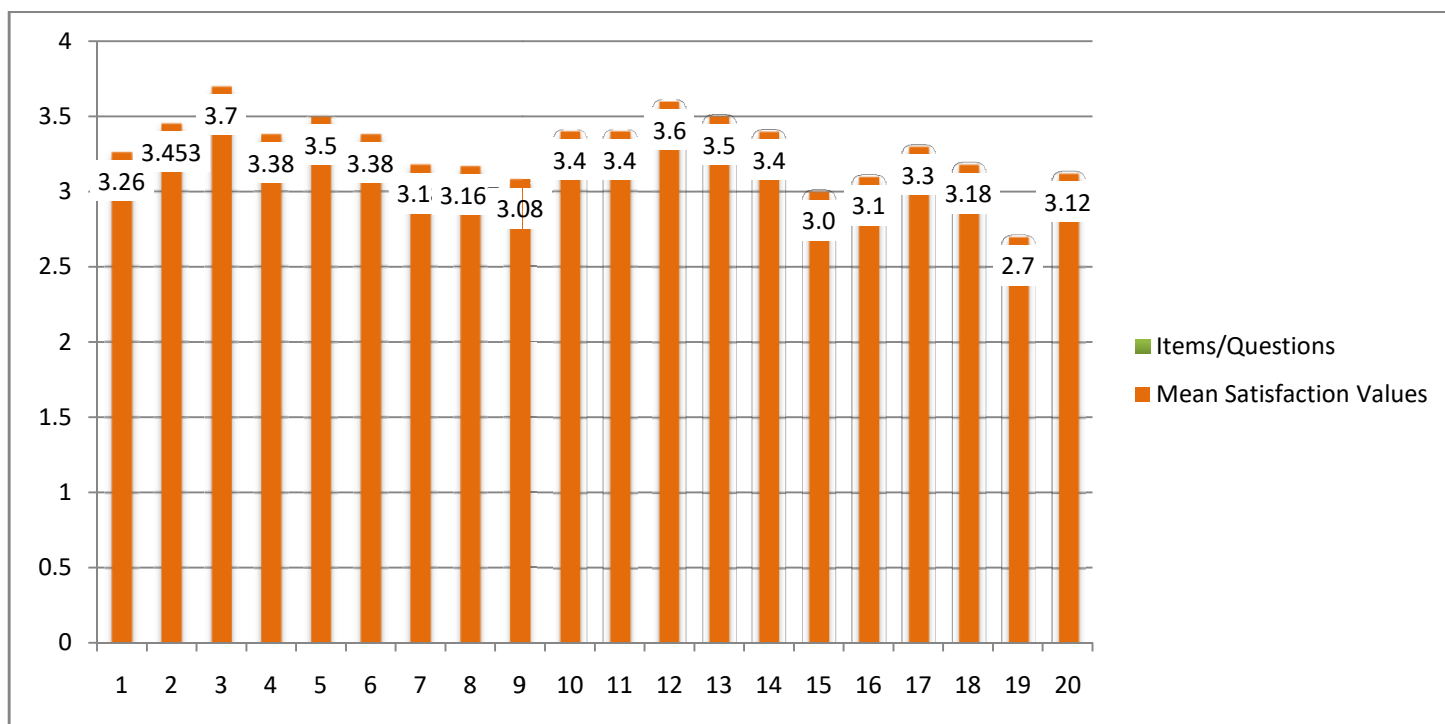
Result:Table one shows Item wise mean values of 20 items (mentioned in table 1). The maximum mean value obtained is **3.7** for item no. 3 which stands for "Teachers Communication Skill". The minimum mean value obtained is **2.7** for item no. 19 which stands for "use of ICT tools by teachers". The overall mean value is **3.28** which shows 82% students have positive satisfaction level for the college.

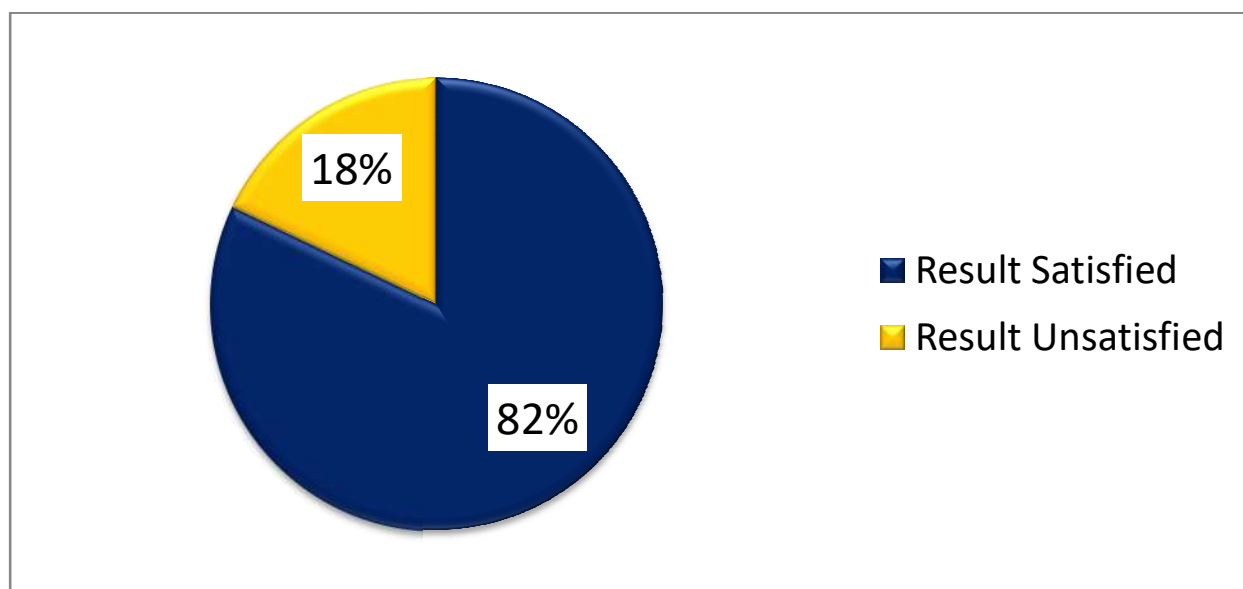

Graphical Representation of Data showing Total Satisfaction Value of the students

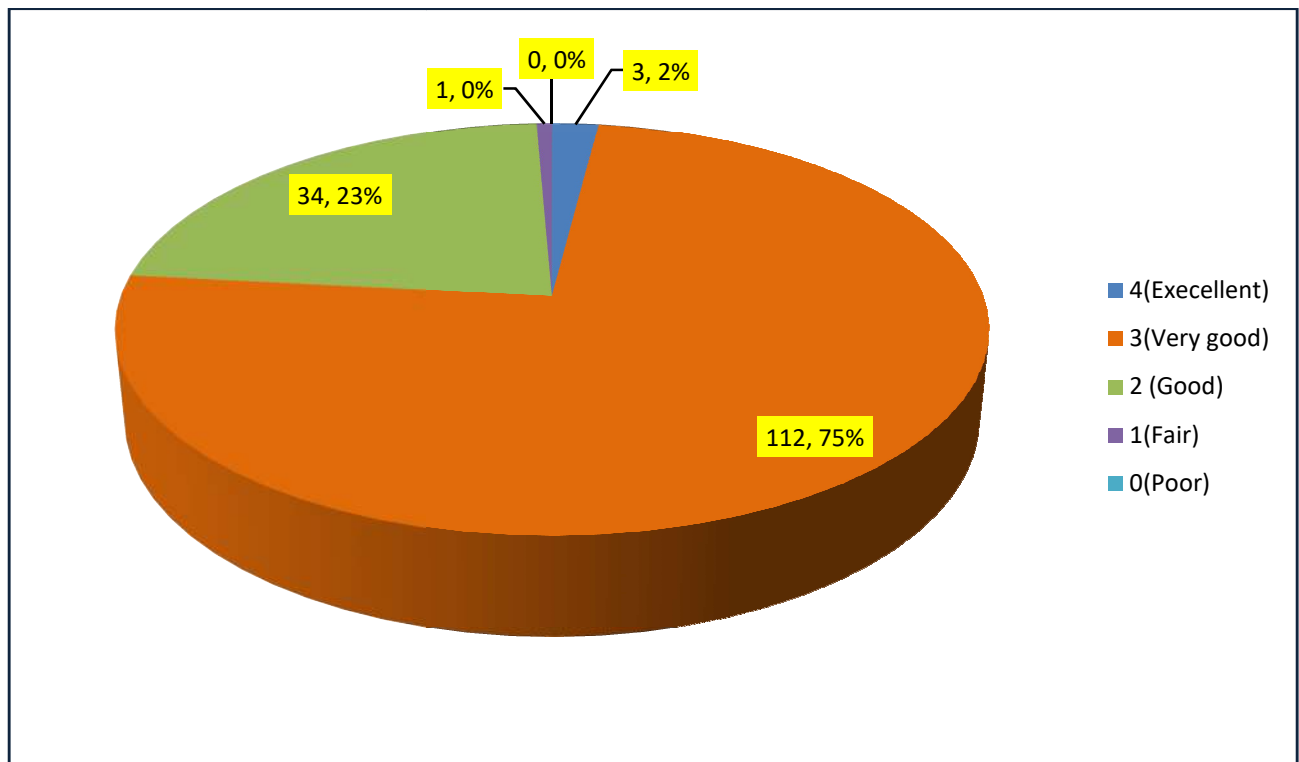

Observations /Suggestions by students to improve the overall teaching-learning experiences in the institution

- A. Development of the college infrastructure:** The students' response suggest that number of class room should be increased. There should be more seating place in the Library. Students have asked for a common room and more numbers of washroom, which should be cleaned daily.
- B. ICT facility in the College:** Some students suggested that they should have access to use computer with internet facility in the library so that they can consult books online.
- C. Development of library facilities:** Suggestion were also made to increase text-books in the library especially in English medium.
- D. Field works/trips:** Many students suggested that excursion, field trips may be organized so that they get more opportunity for practical knowledge.
