Best Practices 2021-22

1. Title of the practice: ISRO-IIRS Network Outreach Program conducted online by Department of Geography

Context that required the initiation of the practice: the Indian Space Research Organisation recognises geospatial technology as an emerging field that shall require trained manpower that can be employed in generating and managing geospatial data in various sectors of agriculture, telecommunications, public safety, etc. The Indian Institute of Remote Sensing has initiated several short and long term courses to cultivate and train manpower for the upcoming industrial need.

Objectives:

Jagat Taran Girls' Degree College initiated this short-term course as it provides an occasion to promote additional skills to its Geography major students to hone their skills and market value. The primary objective of the program was to introduce the students to the fundamental and advanced concepts of remote sensing and data management.

The Practice:

The course was advertised by the Geography department to its undergraduate and postgraduate students. Around fifty students enrolled in the course which was conducted online. Dr. Darshan Jha was the nodal coordinator who assisted and taught the course to the students. The

Obstacles faced and strategies adopted:

The major challenge faced in running the course was to keep the students interested in it since the course was designed for theory as well as practical application. However, the lack of RS & GIS Lab (geospatial software) in the college makes it very hard to provide hands-on practicals and specialized nature of training of geospatial technology. Some students were unable to comprehend the benefits of the program and dropped out without completing the course.

Impact:

The students who completed the online classes and appeared for the final tests displayed a remarkable clarity and understanding of the use of geospatial and remote sensing technology.

The students find themselves equipped to be used as resources for remote sensing and geospatial technology data management.

Resources required:

The course was initiated after the permission of the Principal and the chairperson.

The adoption of the online mode of teaching and interaction required each student and teach to have either a desktop or a laptop, or a Smartphone.

The course was free of cost hence the students were enthusiastic in joining it initially. The Nodal Coordinator managed the students attendance and helped them with the technical glitches in registering for the class as well as guided them with conceptual notes and clarity.

2. Title of the practice: National Cultural Legacy Celebrated
